

"Trepare a way for the Lord."

Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time ~ 18 June 2023

Do you sometimes feel you are not being valued? That people do not know your real worth? As a result, you don't feel inspired to work or do something productive. Demotivated. Then, you must listen to God's message for us today.

In the first reading, God instructed Moses to tell the Israelites how He saved them from their enemies and bore them up on eagle wings and brought them to Himself. If they will listen to Him and keep His covenant, they will be His special possession, dearer to Him than all other people. Dear and special, this is how God treats His people.

And yet, they decided to do otherwise. Their lack of faith led them astray. They became unfaithful and ungrateful. But God put up with them. Not the usual way we would deal with unfaithful and ungrateful people we encounter. God chose to love them still. And He sent His Son for them.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans tells us that while we were still helpless, sinners and enemies of God, at the appointed time, Jesus came and died for us. He did this, so that we could be reconciled with God. Not out of necessity but by sheer love. We are very fortunate that in spite of our weaknesses and even unworthiness, we have a Lover, Who never gives up on us. He is willing to love us beyond reason.

The gospel highlights more God's love in Jesus. Seeing the people troubled and abandoned, Jesus' heart was moved with compassion. He summoned the twelve so that they could share in His mission. He called each of them by name. The same way we are all called to Himself through Baptism. God chose us. We are dear and special to Him.

Yes, some people may not see our true value and we should not let them discourage us. Our being dear and special to God shouldn't likewise lead us to feeling entitled. We must respond to God's love with humility and gratitude. Let us inspire and encourage one another. With enthusiasm, let us work with and for Jesus.

Every time we feel down, let us remember, we have God who always tells us, we are worth loving, sacrificing and dying for. That is how special we all are.
