Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time ~ 25 June 2023

In Matthew's Gospel this week, Jesus instructs his disciples as they prepare to go out into the world to spread the message of the Gospel. At its core, the focus of this passage is to highlight the difference between a fear of ordinary human consequences and the ultimate fear of God's justice and punishment. Jesus teaches his disciples not to fear those who can harm them in this life, but rather to fear the one who has the power to destroy both body and soul in hell.

The message of this passage is as relevant today as it was in Jesus' time. We all have fears in life, whether it is the fear of failure, the fear of rejection, or the fear of physical harm. But as Jesus reminds us, these fears are ultimately temporary and cannot compare to the fear of God's judgment. This is a difficult concept to grasp, but it is essential to our spiritual growth and development.

The task of the community, according to Jesus, is to act together to bear witness to the love and care of God before our fellow human beings. This means that we must be willing to put aside our own fears and concerns and work together to spread the message of the Gospel. We must be willing to reach out to those who are lost and hurting, to show them the love and compassion of Christ, and to help them find their way back to God.

This is a challenging task, but it is also a rewarding one. When we work together as a community to bear witness to the love of God, we can have a powerful impact on the world around us. We can help to bring hope and healing to those who are hurting, and we can inspire others to follow in our footsteps and join us in our mission.

In conclusion, the Gospel teaches us that our ultimate fear should be of God's judgment, not of the temporary fears and concerns of this life. It reminds us that we must work together as a community to spread the message of the Gospel and to bear witness to the love and care of God before our fellow human beings. As we go out into the world, let us remember these words of Jesus and strive to live lives that reflect the love and compassion of Christ.
