



Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ ~11 June 2023

A certain bishop of my acquaintance, before he became a bishop, preached a homily in my hearing on the "real absence" in the Eucharist. Before you get too horrified by the depths to which the Church has sunk I should stress that it was a very sound and orthodox homily. He was making a point which we need to remember in the midst of this great feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord, really and truly present in the Eucharist: It is not enough. We should want more. The Eucharist is a most marvellous gift which the Lord has left us: a gift to

strengthen us, to provide real and effective spiritual help in our daily lives, and to continually remind us of his continuing love and care for us. But it is above all to be, as St Thomas Aquinas

put it, a pledge of future glory. Wonderful as the Eucharist is, it is at heart a keepsake, a token to make our hearts grow fonder and to desire to be reunited with the one whom we love.

Because it is a gift from the Lord himself it far transcends any human token. It is not merely a reminder, like a photograph or even a relic. By it, the Lord is really and truly present with us, body, blood, soul, and divinity. But it is a presence which can be discerned by our faith and our intellect, but not by our physical senses. To them what was once bread and wine seems to look, feel. taste the same.

That is the point about the "real absence." While we should be always grateful for this amazing gift, we should not pretend that it is enough. While through our faith we can know that the Lord is really there with us, yet our physical senses do not respond. And that does not mean those physical senses are unimportant, don't reveal reality to us. We do not believe that only the spiritual is important that our bodily senses are not an essential part of us, enabling us to encounter the Lord.

Our faith teaches us to look forward to a resurrection of the body, to a time when those senses will indeed encounter the Lord face to face. It is why hymns can sing of that time when sacraments shall cease. The Blessed Eucharist, amazing as it is, is not forever. There will be a time when it will no longer be necessary, and its greatest purpose is to help us to come to that time.

So when we adore the Lord in the Eucharist, whether it be in a monstrance at Adoration, or when the Host is lifted up in the mass we should not be ashamed, indeed we should be encouraged, to pray, like a congregation of Oliver Twists, "please Sir, I want some more!"
