Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity ~ 4 June 2023

STUBBORNNESS OF GOD'S EXTRAVAGANT LOVE - TRINITY

'They call me Trinity' is a 1970 comedy film that stars two lazy, good-for nothing, unrepenting Trinity brothers who come to the rescue of a land-grabbing tycoon, Interestingly, while Trinity is a crook and deceitful, he has a heart for the poor and the defenceless. But, his love is limited.

The Solemnity of Trinity that we celebrate today is the centre of the mystery of God in his everlasting love and fidelity. Moses, in the first reading, leads a stubborn and sinful people! Their sinfulness does not restrict or alter God's love for them. Their wilderness journey is an experience of 'God's tenderness and compassion, slowness to anger, richness in tenderness

and faithfulness'!

The cautious Nicodemus, under cover of darkness, encounters Jesus' declaration about God's attitude to the world: "God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that whoever believes in Him, may not perish but have Everlasting Life". Nicodemus was not destined to perish too! God's extravagant love embraces the stiff-necked Israelites. the cautious Nicodemus and every human like you and me.

God's love overpowered our infidelity. God's love survived the death of Jesus and sent the Holy Spirit so that we share in the very life and love of God. Today's solemnity, in honouring the Trinity, celebrates the 'stubbornness of God's extravagant love' for our world and church.

The Trinity is not about wrong mathematics 1+1+1=1, it is more about the 'mystery' of God and the 'Power of One'. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit, all three persons reveal the fulness of the unity of God's love. By 'mystery' we simply mean that we can never say the final word about God. There is always

'more' to know, share and experience God's love. In the person of Jesus, this 'mystery' of God is given a face, a voice, and a tangible language of life and love. Through Jesus, God becomes reachable. Jesus draws us into the communion of the Holy Trinity. Through Jesus, God and humanity meet.

St. Thomas Aquinas was right when he declared that in trying to define God we suffer from the 'misery of language'. God can be experienced only in the language of love – in creating, redeeming and sanctifying. None of the Trinity ever tires of loving the world and you!

We daily sign ourselves in the powerful name of the Trinity – Father, Son and Spirit. In his letters, St Paul always greeted his people in these words: "The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Love of God and the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all!" The main altar in this Cathedral is dedicated to the Holy Trinity. It is a daily reminder of God's extravagant love for you.
