Fouth Sunday of Advent and Christmas $\sim 24 \text{Th}$ December 2023

This Sunday the Gospel of Luke unfolds the Annunciation story, a moment of divine revelation that holds profound significance in the Christian narrative. At its core, this passage speaks to the essence of a new creation and the awe-inspiring wonder accompanying each birth.

The angel Gabriel appears to Mary, a humble young woman, announcing that she will conceive and bear a son through the Holy Spirit. This miraculous conception marks the beginning of the Incarnation, the embodiment of God in human form, a pivotal moment in the Christian story. Mary's response to this extraordinary message is one of humble acceptance and faith, saying, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."

The essential point of the Annunciation Story in Luke is that of a new creation. In the conception of Jesus, we witness the divine initiating a transformative act, bringing forth something entirely new and unimaginable. This event signals God's redemptive plan for humanity, a plan rooted in the profound mystery of the Incarnation. Each birth, but particularly this one, carries the promise of renewal and the potential for a fresh start.

Moreover, the Annunciation challenges us to cultivate a joyful desire to be part of the new creation that God is bringing about. Mary's response exemplifies a deep trust and willingness to participate in God's unfolding plan. Her fiat, her "yes" to God's invitation, sets an example for us to embrace God's call with joy and surrender. In a world often marked by uncertainty and challenges, this passage encourages us to approach the divine with open hearts, ready to be transformed and used for God's purpose.

The wonder of the Annunciation invites us to marvel at the beauty of creation and the divine's continual work in our lives. Just as Mary's acceptance led to the birth of Jesus, our openness to God's call can lead to new beginnings and the unfolding of God's redemptive story in our lives.
