"Trepare a way for the Lord."

### THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME~ 21ST JANUARY 2024

This third Sunday of Ordinary Time is now known in the Church as Word of God Sunday. As such, it calls us to pay particular attention to the readings for the mass. And we immediately find ourselves being challenged, both in the first reading and the Gospel, to repent.

For many of us today the cry "Repent" is something we are more inclined to associate with someone standing on a street corner, a staple of traditional street preaching, and yet it is something we should really hear more often at church than we do. In fact, it is a call we should want to hear more often. St Mark makes clear in today's Gospel that the call to repentance was at the heart of Jesus's mission. So it also, clearly, a key part of being a follower of Jesus.

But it isn't a comfortable call. It means facing up to the fact that there are things we need to repent of. That our lives are often not what they should be. Still more challenging is the fact that a lot of the things wrong with our lives are not just one-offs, or occasional hiccups, but continuing, repetitive, failures. The Church is full, in fact, of people whose lives are often a series of failures and, if I see that around me, I have to admit I see the clearest example when I look in the mirror.

That could be a depressing thought. However, Jesus's proclamation didn't end with the cry "Repent!" That was only the first part of a call that concludes: "and believe the Good News." Because repentance isn't chiefly about looking back at what we have done wrong. It is about looking forward to the change we desire to see. And the great gift that comes from the Gospel, the "Good News", is that we receive God's grace which makes it possible for us to change.

If we doubt that, if we get too depressed by our repeated failures, then let's consider those Jesus calls. Simon Peter, whose courage will fail in the midst of a miracle, walking on the water. Peter who, having declared his readiness to die will, when the moments comes, will run away and hide. James and John who will obsess about authority and desire a place at the Lord's hand, but be too scared to ask and get Mum to do it. And yet that gift of grace made them the great saints we rightly venerate to this day.


